Annual Report Given by the Association's President Mike Harris. at the AGM held on 14th Oct 2025 at Coorparoo RSL Club:

The effective use of these communication channels has markedly improved our outreach. We have been invited to a range of events where we have been able to distribute our key promotional brochure - "Who We Are", which has once again increased our list of contacts among kindred organisations.

Successful Activities and Events

Over the past 12 months, our Brisbane Association has proudly organised and participated in a series of successful events:

- January 2025 – Australia Day Luncheon held at Secretary Teresa Pokoj's home was highlighted by the ever-popular *Australiana Quiz Contest*, and lively games and the many great raffle prizes won.
- May 2025 – The 83rd Anniversary of the Battle of the Coral Sea service, held at the Australian American War Memorial at Newstead Park. This major commemoration service was attended by

the Consul-Generals of the US, Japan, France, the Philippines and Papua New Guinea; as well as representatives of the US Ambassador, Indian Consul General, Australian Prime Minister, Queensland Premier, Brisbane Lord Mayor, Federal and State Governments, the U.S. and Australian Armed Forces, Returned Services Organisations, Veterans and their families. With approximately 300 invited guests with 76 wreath-layers, this year's service was an outstanding success. My sincere thanks again go to the U.S. Navy 7th Fleet Band, HMAS Moreton's Commander, and the Royal Australian Navy Band Qld for their magnificent participation.

- 4 July 2025 – Independence Day Soiree held at the United Service Club, once more featuring the popular "Americana Quiz Contest," enjoyable games and many raffle prizes won.
- Monthly Meet & Greet Nights – held at the United Service Club. These 10 event gatherings per year, have grown immensely in popularity and provide an enjoyable and relaxed environment for members and friends to socialise.

War Memorial Services

Over the past year, our Board and members have proudly attended more than 20 War Memorial Services, laying wreaths on behalf of the Association. I especially thank our Secretary, Teresa Pokoj, for crafting all wreaths from flowers grown in her own garden - an extraordinary contribution that saves our Association more than \$4,000 each year in florist fees.

Publications

As Publications Editor for the past 13 years, I am pleased to have produced numerous Quarterly Newsletters and News Flashes. Our major promotional brochure, "Who We Are", has again been updated and remains an essential tool in introducing our Association to the wider community.

Looking to the Future

Looking ahead, I am committed to expanding our fundraising efforts, seeking corporate sponsorships and pursuing further grants. To date, we have not secured corporate sponsorship, and this must remain a priority.

We also urgently need more active members to assist in the hands-on organisation of our expanding program of activities. Membership numbers have declined this year, and a renewed, well-planned membership drive for 2026 is essential.

Presidential Message on the 83rd Anniversary of the Battle of the Coral Sea.

The White House May 4, 2025.

Today, I extend my heartfelt greetings to the people of Australia as we commemorate the 83rd anniversary of the Battle of the Coral Sea, a pivotal moment in the fight against tyranny and a defining chapter in the enduring alliance between our two nations.

At the height of World War II, American and Australian forces fought for 4 grueling days against enemy naval and air forces in the Coral Sea. Through their heroic bravery, their unwavering resolve, and the grace of Almighty God, our Allied forces halted at great cost a major enemy advancement for the first time in the Pacific Theatre and sank an enemy aircraft carrier for the first time- marking a significant turning point in the war and paving the way for the enemy's eventual defeat.

As we commemorate this historic battle, we also remember the 656 Allied service members who gave their lives for our liberty. The courage of those fallen heroes not only changed the course of the war but also forged a glorious bond between the United States and Australia that endures to this day—a friendship that remains foundational to Indo-Pacific security and prosperity.

Today, we honor the fearless determination of those who fought at the Coral Sea, and we solemnly remember those who laid down their lives to secure the future of freedom. Their sacrifice will forever be etched in our hearts, and our nations remain eternally grateful.

The Admirals Delegation of 13 persons included the US Navy 3 Star Vice Admiral Jeff Jablon (Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Installations and Logistics), 2 Star Rear Admiral Naoya Hoshi (Director General of Logistics Department, Maritime Staff Office, Japan Maritime Self Defense Force (JMSDF) and Commodore Catherine Rhodes (Director General Logistics, Royal Australian Navy (RAN), Naval Captains and Staff Members.
